THE FINAL QUARTER

The final quarter of a game offers an opportunity to catch up if you're behind, or to increase your lead if you're ahead. Often both teams are

exhausted and battle-weary, but they must summon the strength to compete one more quarter. The Peabody Class of 68 has entered the final quarter. By God's grace we have exceeded the proverbial "three scores and ten" (Ps. 90:10). With a few exceptions, our class will turn seventy-five (75) this year. Many are retired and all of us are eligible for either Social Security, or what our elders called "Old Age Pension". Securing applicants for our scholarship has been more challenging than anticipated, and unfortunately, we did not receive any applications this year. Considering this, we explored alternative ways to support students and discovered that both the Debate Club and the football team were in need of financial assistance. The Debate Club, which is traveling to Washington, D.C. required funds for airfare, and we donated \$1,000 to their cause.

Bolton High School has transitioned into a pre-kindergarten through 12th-grade academic and performing arts magnet school. Consequently, high school students not interested in this specialization had to transfer to other schools, with many

choosing Peabody. As a result, the football team expanded from 40 to 85 players and needed new helmets. Because this is a safety issue, we contributed \$1,500 from our scholarship fund to meet this need.
